MISSION MONTH

In the Catholic Church, October has long been associated with mission. The month starts with the feast of St Thérèse of Lisieux and draws to a close with **World Mission Sunday** — a special day of prayer and global solidarity celebrated in all Catholic parishes around the world. Pope Francis has taken may steps to encourage all members of Catholic communities to recognize themselves as missionary disciples; working and praying together to share God's love with everyone, everywhere. The theme for this year's World Mission Day is "Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move" [Luke 24: 13-35] inspired by the story of Jesus appearing to His disciples on the road to Emmaus. NEXT SUNDAY IS MISSION SUNDAY

World Mission Sunday is the Holy Father's annual appeal for spiritual and financial support so that the life-giving work of overseas mission and missionaries can continue. It always falls on the second last Sunday in October (**this year on next Sunday 22nd October**), and like the Good Friday collection for the Holy Land and Peter's Pence, it is one of three yearly universal Church collections. World Mission Sunday collections take place in every single parish where the Church is present. This includes not only Ireland and Europe, but also in poorer parishes in developing countries. It is a moment of universal solidarity when each member of the Church family, regardless of location or background, play their part in supporting each other. This is what makes it such a special celebration. Right now, missionaries desperately need your help. In many poorer

parishes in Africa, Asia, and Latin America missionaries are serving on the front line. They already do so much, walking hand-in-hand with marginalised communities, long before and after any emergency. You can show missionaries you care by supporting World Mission Sunday.
