TODAY IS WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

The Mission Commenced with the Commissioning of the Disciples: ¹⁶ Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. ¹⁷ When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. ¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. The Mission Continues: Today, Sunday 22nd October 2023, World Mission Sunday is being celebrated throughout the Church. It is the one Sunday of the year when the Mass is celebrated exclusively for missionary activity. Donations collected at worldwide Masses this Sunday go, in their entirety, to support churches, hospitals, schools and vocations where the Church is new, young or poor. World Mission Sunday offers all Catholics the chance to show love and solidarity to our brothers and sisters who share our faith. And the Church joins missionaries everywhere to support them in spreading the Gospel.

Pope Francis has chosen this year's theme 'Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move', which is inspired by the Gospel of Luke (cf 24:13 - 35) and the story of the disciples on the road to Emmaus who encounter Christ. The theme salutes the women and men who commit their vocational life to service as missionaries to people around the world living in abject poverty, where hunger and poverty are omnipresent.

On Mission Sunday, the faithful are asked to contribute what they can at Mass to support missionaries during the World Mission Sunday nationwide collection. Earlier this month, during their Autumn General Meeting in Maynooth, the bishops expressed their deep

appreciation to everyone who contributed to the 2022 mission collection of over \notin 1.3m, raised across Ireland to support seminarians, missionary priests, sisters, brothers and catechists, on World Mission Sunday.
