WHY IS OCTOBER THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY?

This is associated with the **Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary** which we celebrate on **7**th **October**. This feast was instituted by Pope Pius V to celebrate the miraculous victory of Christian naval forces against the Islamic Ottoman fleet in the **Battle of Lepanto on 7**th **October 1571.** It is said that this was the largest naval battle in Western history. Relying not only upon military might, Pope Pius V urged the faithful in Europe to pray the rosary. Just two years before this, the same Pope had approved the rosary in its present form. After the miraculous victory, Pope Pius V attributed it to the power of the rosary, so the feast also became known as the feast of **Our Lady of Victory**. In 1884, Pope Leo XIII officially declared October to be the **month of the rosary** through his encyclical *Superiore Anno*: "We have therefore resolved that in this...month of **October**, in which the sacred devotions to **Our Virgin Lady of the Rosary** are solemnised throughout the Catholic world…" [Extracted from an article by **Jocelyn Soriano** on the webpage: https://www.patheos.com/blogs/beloved/2023/10/why-is-october-the-month-of-the-holy-rosary/...]
