REEK SUNDAY

On next Sunday, 30th July, Archbishop Eamon Martin Primate of All Ireland, will join with thousands of pilgrims of all ages in the annual pilgrimage to the summit of **Croagh Patrick**, Ireland's holy mountain, for **Reek Sunday 2023**. Croagh Patrick (2,510ft/765m) is a physically demanding pilgrimage which has been undertaken for over 1500 years. From 8.00am on Reek Sunday, Mass will be celebrated on the hour outside of the chapel on the summit. SOME ADVICE FOR PILGRIMS: ► While climbing, stay on the defined path on the mountain (where in place) and do not encroach on the adjoining habitat which may be in the process of restoration. ► Be respectful to the mountain streams which provide drinking water to the local community. ► Support the 'Leave No Trace' principle by not discarding litter on the mountain and by appropriately disposing of any that you might come across. ► Dogs are not permitted on the mountain.

LIGHT THE FIRE

On Sunday August 6th Archbishop Eamon Martin Primate of All Ireland will relight the fire on **the hill of Slane** that was lit by St. Patrick many years ago. He will be

joined by Sr. Briege McKenna, Dana and Fr. Pablo. There will be Holy Mass, rosary and a Eucharistic healing service on the day. This is a unique and monumental event.
