In Down, three saints one grave do fill, Patrick, Brigid and Columcille.

Next Wednesday 1st February (in the Irish tradition, the first day of spring) is also the feast day of Saint Brigid, one of Ireland's three national saints along with St. Patrick and St. Columba (Columcille). She is patroness of many things, including poetry, learning, healing, protection, blacksmithing, livestock and dairy production. St.Brigid, also known as "Mary of the Gael", is accredited with first creating the unique cross which bears her name. This cross is normally hand created from rushes (however occasionally straw is also used). The St. Brigid's Cross (with its distinctive design, made from woven rushes) is thought to keep evil, fire and hunger from the homes in which it is displayed.
