## LENT: BEING GUIDED BY THE WORD OF GOD.

When we buy an electrical or mechanical product, it comes with a user manual. This user manual enables us to comprehend how to use the product correctly. Sometimes, we do not read the manual and end up underutilising that product or, in some cases, destroying it. A user manual guides the user on how to operate the product optimally. Understanding the user manual can be likened to understanding the Bible's Word and word of God. The Bible can be described as a user manual that should guide our every word and action. Psalm 119:105 says, "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."

During Lent, reading the Bible holds particular importance as it offers us an opportunity for spiritual reflection, renewal, and preparation for the celebration of Easter. During Lent, engaging in daily scripture reading and meditating on passages highlighting themes of repentance, redemption, and the journey of faith is highly recommended.

Reading the Bible during Lent provides a framework for deepening our understanding of the Word and word of God and its relevance in our lives. It allows us to immerse ourselves in the narratives of our salvation history, from the Old Testament prophecies foretelling the coming of the Messiah to the New Testament accounts of the ministry of Jesus, his Passion and resurrection. Reading and reflecting on God's word in scripture invites us to uniquely encounter God's love, mercy, and grace. May we find strength, comfort, and guidance for our spiritual journey as we read and reflect on the word of God this Lenten season. Amen.
